

English

In English this term we will be writing our own campfire stories, which will require the children to be creative in their ideas and use of language.

In the second half of the term we will be using a video stimulus to write a discursive text based on the rights or wrongs of going to war. The children will learn to use formal language and develop their own arguments that are supported by evidence.

PE

In PE the children will be developing their balance and co-ordination skills through gymnastics and dance.

Art

The 'The Seaside' unit will teach the class how to use pen and colour, how to print, and make lanterns.

Topic

Our topic for this term is called 'Tomorrow's World'. The children will learn about the history of the internet, how websites are constructed and the importance of different types of networks. We will touch in how viruses work and how to stop them,

Computing

'Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence' will teach pupils to understand how computers use information to learn by solving new problems and follow new instructions.

RE

Children will explore the definition of and popular ideas relating to the concept of 'Eternity' across a range of religions and spiritual beliefs.

French

'Me in the world'. In this unit the children will learn about the many countries in the Francophone world and that we are different and yet all the same.

Maths

In Maths the children will learn how to associate a fraction with division and calculate decimal fraction equivalents for a simple fraction. The children will also add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions.

Science

This 'Living Things and Their Habitats' unit will teach the class about the classification of living things, including micro-organisms. The children will build on their work in Year 4 by sorting animals into groups based on their similarities and differences.

PSHE

This term we will complete our work on keeping safe. We will also be doing sex education and some transition work.
