Covid Update: Thankfully, Covid infections amongst primary aged children has begun to decline. The Prime Minister is set to make some important decisions on the 21st February which we wait to hear. We, as a Trust, will remain very cautious as our priority is to keep school safe and open. I will keep you updated on any changes.

Attendance: Attendance is really important however our attendance has been lower this half term (January and February) Some of it is because of children having to isolate. Unfortunately, I must send attendance letters to parents whose children's attendance dips below 90%. We do however consider that Covid isolation may have impacted on low attendance. Do call the school and speak to me if you have any questions about your child's attendance. Average attendance should be 96%.

Teaching Students: We will again be welcoming teaching students in the new half term. They will be in year 5 as well as in 3S.


