Scooter Racks & Halloween: A BIG thank you to PATCH for our new scooter racks. It looks so much nicer having a special place for scooters and not just a big pile!








Year 2 Open day: If any year 2 parents want to have a look around the school, please check out these dates. I will do a short presentation in the hall and some of our prefects will show them around.
