English

In English, children will be learning how to write diary entries from a character's perspective. They will learn how to punctuate speech within their writing and show dialogue when writing conversations between characters. In guided reading, children will read 'War Horse' by Michael Morpurgo and continue to develop and improve their range of comprehension skills based on the book.





Graffiti - Art or Vandalism?

Maths

In maths, children will be revisiting multiplication and division and applying this skill to fluency, reasoning and problem solving questions.

Using their knowledge of multiplication and division, children will then look at different representations of fractions. This will include: fractions of shapes, fractions of amounts, adding and subtracting fractions and comparing and ordering fractions.

Computing

In ICT, the children will be developing their word processing skills which will include how to organise text for different purposes. They will then learn how to crop and rotate images for a specific effect. Children will also continue to develop their understanding of online safety when remote learning.

PΕ

In PE, 5AW will be swimming next half term. 5KW will be learning the skills to play volleyball.

Music

The focus in music next half term will be, 'How Does Music Improve Our World?' using Charanga to support the children's learning

Science

In science, children will be learning about living things and their habitats. They will describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, amphibian, insect and bird—exploring how metamorphosis works. They will then describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

RE

In RE, children explore 'Stewardship'. This is where the children learn the importance of looking after objects, property and living things.

Spanish

We will be learning how to order in a café using Spanish. This will include revisiting prior learning of core vocabulary to build on conversation.

Topic—Geography

Children will learn about local street art, incorporating geographical map work in to their work. This will include learning about grid referencing for local maps, and the wider world.

Exploring beyond our local area, the children will begin to identify physical and human geography characteristics of cities and countries around the world and make comparisons.

PSHE

Children will focus on living in the wider world. This includes health and wellbeing issues, law making, dealing with conflict, and anti-social behaviour.
