


Spring 2024 Newsletter

Our term begun with the fantastic news that Stamshaw Junior School is a 'good' school as judged by Ofsted. I feel that the opening statement *"pupils are flourishing both academically and pastorally because of the school's high expectations"* does sum up our school. We do our best to make learning memorable at SJS and I am so grateful to you all for continued support of our great little school. I say little however since I stared here at SJS nearly 5 years ago, we have 100 more pupils so we are certainly growing! We are almost at 300.

Anglo Saxon Day: SJS brought the Butser experience to Year 4 and gave the children the opportunity to see what life was like in Anglo-Saxon times. The children took part in three different <u>activities</u>. Mrs Piper showed Year 4 how to make Anglo-Saxon brooches using cardboard, string, tin foil and paint.

Mr Barrand set up an artefact hunt in our pond area along with playing board games. Mr Massey's session involved the children building a fence using the technique of wattling. The children also carved some patterns into chalk and decorated the outdoor classroom with Anglo-Saxon runes.

The day ended with parents coming in to share the experiences together.


